Cookie policy

1 Cookies

This website, https://armorkw.pl (hereinafter: the "website") uses cookies and other related technologies (for convenience all technologies are referred to as "cookies"). Cookies are also placed by external parties. Cookies are information stored by servers on the User's terminal equipment. This information can be read each time the User connects from this terminal device. Cookies are in particular text files containing IT data. They are stored on the User's terminal equipment and used when browsing websites. Cookies usually contain data such as the name of the website that stored them, an identification number and the expiry time of the file. Sometimes they also contain other current data allowing the portal to function properly.

The entity placing cookies on the User's terminal equipment and accessing them is the Operator of this website, i.e. Armor KW Sp. z o.o., a limited liability company: Armor KW spółka z ograniczoną odpowiedzialnością with its registered office in Małogoszcz (28-366) ul. Osiedle 17 lok. 6, entered in the Register of Entrepreneurs of the National Court Register kept by the District Court in Kielce, X Economic Division of the National Court Register under KRS number 0000959574; NIP 6562345546, REGON 521446793. 2 What are scripts?

A script is a piece of programme code which is used to make our website work properly and interactively. This code is executed on our server or on your device.

3 What is a pixel tag?

A web beacon (or pixel tag) is a small, invisible piece of text or image on a website that is used to monitor website traffic. To do this, various data about you are stored using web beacons.

4 What are cookies used for?

Cookies are used for:

(a) adapting the content of this website to the User's preferences and optimising the use of the website by recognising the User's terminal device from which the website is accessed and thus displaying the content of the website in a manner personalised to the User by remembering the pre-selected display options.

b) Collecting and analysing anonymous statistics on site visits in order to adapt the content of the site to meet your expectations and preferences.

5 What data do we process about you?

The Administrator may process data relating to your use of the website by means of a computer, phone, tablet or other device through which you access the websites. Some of this data, in combination

with other data, may constitute personal data. By means of the Internet technologies used, the Administrator may process, for example:

- the name of the website from which the cookies originate, the length of time they are stored on the terminal device and their unique number;

- device data (e.g. device type/model, unique device identifiers, MAC address, IP address, operating system, operating system version and device settings, language set, screen resolution, browser version and type);

- events (e.g. time of use, last visit to the website, length of the visit to the website, type of pages and sub-pages visited);

- location data (e.g. IP address, data about your location obtained through various positioning technologies);

- other data: website usage data (e.g. the source of the hits, the advertising campaign from which you accessed the website, the links you clicked on, which adverts you saw and which cookie banner consents you gave).

6 Types of cookies used

Breakdown by length of storage:

Temporary (session) - they are saved when the user logs in to the portal and are deleted when the user logs out or closes the web browser

Permanent - are saved when the user visits the website/logs in and remain in the memory of the device for the time specified in the parameters of the "cookies" file or until they are deleted by the user.

Breakdown by impact on the operation of the website:

Essential - this type of "cookie" has a direct impact on the correct operation of the portal. If you block them, you will not be able to use the materials in our databases correctly.

The personal data collected by means of essential cookies are processed by us:

- on the basis of Article 6(1)(f) RODO (legitimate interest of the controller to ensure the operation of the website);

- on the basis of Article 6(1)(b) RODO (activities aimed at concluding a contract or performing a contract to which the data subject is a party).

Optional (functional) - files which improve/enrich the functionality of the website. Without them, the website will function but the convenience of using the content and its attractiveness may be impaired.

The personal data collected by means of functional cookies are processed by us on the basis of Article 6(1)(a) RODO (user consent).

Statistical (analytical) cookies - do not directly affect the functionality of the portal instance launched by the user, but without them the overall quality of the portal may deteriorate and the content may be less suited to the needs of users.

We process the personal data collected by means of analytical cookies on the basis of Article 6(1)(a) RODO (user consent).

Marketing (advertising) cookies - allow us to display advertisements that are more interesting to users and at the same time more valuable to publishers and advertisers; cookies can also be used to personalise advertising, as well as to display advertisements outside the websites.

We process the personal data collected by means of marketing (advertising) cookies on the basis of Article 6(1)(a) RODO (user consent).

Breakdown by origin of 'cookies':

Internal/proprietary - files stored directly by the portal

External - files saved by external solution providers (e.g. Google Analytics), whose components may be included on the portal. This website does not use external cookies and does not pass on data to third parties.

7 The following cookies are used on this website

Our Service contains functions for sharing content through social networks. The Operator of the Website may collect information such as the IP address used or the pages visited or stored in cookies. The collection of this information is set out in the privacy policies of the entities that enable such features.

When visiting our social media profile, the User goes to an external service where the data processing rules set by that service apply. 8 Consent

10. cookie management

Very often, the software used to browse the Internet (the so-called Internet browser) has the handling and storage of cookies on the User's terminal equipment enabled by default. The User is entitled to decide on the access of cookies to his/her computer by selecting them in advance in his/her browser window.

Any User who does not agree to the use of cookies is obliged to modify their browser settings. Configuration of the User's system to allow the use of cookies implies consent to the storage by the Administrator of the information referred to in Article 173(2) of the Act of 16 July 2004. - Telecommunications Law.
